PROVIDER CERTIFICATION FOR SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER FACILITIES

This ForwardHealth Update announces provider certification changes for substance use disorder (SUD) facilities, including a new allowable certification for adult residential integrated behavioral health stabilization services, effective October 1, 2022. Per the revised Wis. Admin. Code ch. <u>DHS 75</u>, this Update focuses on the certification for current Medicaidenrolled SUD facilities that may provide one of the following:

- Outpatient services
- Substance abuse day treatment services
- Residential SUD services
- Services through an opioid treatment program

The revised Wis. Admin. Code ch. DHS 75 was published on October 1, 2021, and goes into effect on October 1, 2022.

Other certification and coverage policy changes, including new coverage, related to the revised Wis. Admin. Code ch. DHS 75 will be addressed in future ForwardHealth publications.

New Allowable Place of Service for Crisis Stabilization Services

Beginning October 1, 2022, ForwardHealth will reimburse Medicaid-enrolled crisis intervention providers for crisis stabilization services rendered by a certified 75.56 Adult Residential Integrated Behavioral Health Stabilization Service. All crisis stabilization services must conform to the standards in Wis. Admin. Code ch. DHS 34.

ForwardHealth currently does not cover withdrawal management services, but providers with the new Wis. Admin. Code § DHS 75.56 certification, effective October 1, 2022, may contract with counties to provide crisis stabilization services.

If a new facility will be added as a DHS 75.56 facility on or after October 1, 2022, providers will need to follow the standard Medicaid enrollment process.

Prior Authorization/Residential Substance Use Disorder Treatment Attachment Form

In February 2023, ForwardHealth will revise the Prior Authorization/ Residential Substance Use Disorder Treatment Attachment (PA/RSUD) form, F-02567 (02/2023), to ensure the DHS 75 references are aligned with the revised Wis. Admin. Code ch. DHS 75.

Effective for dates of service on and after February 13, 2023, providers must use the revised PA/RSUD form when submitting PA requests for residential SUD services.

ForwardHealth will honor PA requests submitted with the PA/RSUD form (dated 01/2021) that are approved before February 13, 2023.

Providers should refer to the Forms page of the Portal for all current PA forms and instructions.

Documentation Retention

Providers are reminded that they must follow the documentation retention requirements per Wis. Admin. Code § <u>DHS 106.02(9)</u>. Providers are required to produce or submit documentation, or both, to DHS upon request. Per Wis. Stat. § <u>49.45(3)(f)</u>, providers of services shall maintain records as required by DHS for verification of provider claims for reimbursement. DHS may audit such records to verify actual provision of services and the appropriateness and accuracy of claims. DHS may deny or recoup payment for services that fail to meet these requirements. Refusal to produce documentation may result in sanctions including, but not limited to, termination from the Medicaid program.
