
Federally Qualified Health Center

- SSCHC serves in a medically underserved area and population
- Serve anyone who walks through our doors regardless of:
 - Age
 - Income
 - Insurance status/ability to pay
 - Immigration status
- Offers a sliding fee scale for uninsured patients
- Is governed by a patient-majority Board of Directors
- Participates in federal reporting requirements

In 2021, Sixteenth Street served approximately **41,500 people**




Our Patients
