

Can Our School Bill ForwardHealth for Providing School-Based Services?

Effective for the 2025–2026 school year, ForwardHealth has expanded school-based services (SBS) for Medicaid-enrolled students who are between 3 and 21 years old during the school term.

Answer these questions to determine if your school can submit claims for SBS to ForwardHealth.

Is the student enrolled in Wisconsin Medicaid?

All eligible Medicaid-enrolled students with general health care service needs can receive SBS.

Does the student have a medical need or disability?

SBS are considered medically necessary when the service identifies, treats, manages, or addresses a medical problem or a mental, emotional, or physical disability.

Does the student have a written plan for the services?

Students who have any of the following plans are eligible for SBS:

- Individualized Education Program (IEP)
- Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP)
- 504 Plan
- Individualized Health Plan
- Behavioral Health Plan
- Other plans developed by a medical professional within their scope of practice where medical necessity has been established, as defined by Wis. Admin. Code § DHS 101.03(96m)

Was an allowable school-based service provided?

Providers must wait to submit claims until after the allowable service has been provided.

Is there an allowable procedure code for those services?

Refer to the <u>interactive maximum allowable fee schedule</u> on the ForwardHealth Portal for a complete list of allowable SBS procedure codes and related coverage information.

If the answer to all of these questions is yes, the school can bill ForwardHealth for SBS.
