### **Oral Health Status**

#### PURPOSE OF THIS SECTION:

To obtain information about the woman's current oral health habits and to identify behavioral risk factors that may indicate poor oral hygiene and may influence the outcome of her current pregnancy. The relationship between a woman's oral health and that of her baby is important. Dental caries is an infectious disease caused by the bacteria *Streptococcus mutans*. Pregnant women with severe periodontal disease are at increased risk to have preterm or low birth weight babies because of the infection. In addition, the bacteria can be passed from mother to child when sharing eating utensils, tasting foods and kissing.
