Wisconsin Medicaid and BadgerCare Information for Providers

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Family Care began January 1 in Richland County

On January 1, 2001, Richland County began its Family Care pilot program. Family Care is Wisconsin's new, flexible comprehensive long term care health program. This voluntary program offers increased consumer choice, improved access to services, and improved quality through a focus on health and social outcomes. Family Care long term care services include those previously provided through the home and community-based waivers, the Community Options Program benefits, and select Medicaid benefits. Family Care pilots are operating in Fond du Lac, La Crosse, Milwaukee, and Portage counties.

Care Management Organizations (CMOs) provide long term care and health care services, coordinate the provision of other services, and promote preventative services for members enrolled in Family Care. Aging and Disability Services of Richland County is the CMO for Family Care in Richland County. Richland County's CMO offers benefits to the following categories of individuals with long term care needs:

- Elderly, age 65 and over.
- Physically disabled, age 18 to 64.
- Developmentally disabled, age 18 to 64.

Acute and primary care services, including physician and hospital services and prescription medications, are not covered by Family Care for any member. If the Family Care member is also eligible for Medicaid, Wisconsin Medicaid will reimburse providers for acute and primary care services.







The following diagrams show *some* of the Medicaid Web site main menu selections with *some* of the subject areas they contain listed to the right. +







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
