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Wisconsin Medicaid and BadgerCare Information for Providers

Wisconsin Medicaid provider certification packets available on Medicaid Web site

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Providers who want to become Medicaid-certified may obtain Wisconsin Medicaid certification packets for their service-specific provider type on the Medicaid Web site at www.dhfs.state.wi.us/medicaid/.

Downloading and printing certification packets from the Medicaid Web site

Most Wisconsin Medicaid provider certification packets are available as Portable Document Format (PDF) files on the Medicaid Web site at www.dhfs.state.wi.us/medicaid/. Providers may download PDF files to their computers and view and/or print them using Adobe Acrobat Reader®. Once printed, a certification packet made from a PDF looks exactly like the paper copy a provider would receive if one was requested through Wisconsin Medicaid Provider Services. Adobe Acrobat Reader® can be downloaded at no charge from the Adobe® Web site at www.adobe.com/.

These certification packets are for providers who are not yet Medicaid-certified. Providers who are currently Medicaid-certified do not need to complete these packets.

Locating certification packets on the Medicaid Web site

To find a Wisconsin Medicaid provider certification application:

1. Choose "Medicaid Provider Publications" from the main menu of the Medicaid Web site home page at www.dhfs.state.wi.us/medicaid/.
2. Go to the "Certification Packets" topic area in the alphabetical list of topics on the left side of the screen.
3. Select "Provider Certification Packets" to view an alphabetical list of certification packets by provider type.
4. From this list, select "PDF" by the desired certification packet.
5. If Adobe Acrobat Reader® is available on the provider's computer, the certification packet will open as a single PDF document, with all its sections included. Double click on the printer icon near the top of the screen, or select the commands "File" and then "Print" to print the packet in its entirety.
6. At the bottom left of the window for Adobe Acrobat Reader® is a page counter that displays the total number of pages in the document and the number of the page the

provider is currently viewing. For example, if the page counter displays “1 of 28,” the document consists of 28 pages and Page 1 is currently displayed on the screen. Use this counter to verify that all pages of the packet have printed. The number of pages printed will not reflect the page numbers on the document.

Download time

Because of the size of the document files, the certification packets may take longer to download and print than other publications. While most *Wisconsin Medicaid and BadgerCare Updates* download in seconds, it may take up to four or five minutes to obtain a certification packet depending on the size of the packet and the speed of the provider’s computer or modem.

Certification effective date

If a provider uses a certification packet obtained from the Web, the earliest possible certification effective date is the date Wisconsin Medicaid receives the packet. In cases where the packet has missing or incorrect information, Wisconsin Medicaid returns the packet to the provider and gives the provider a 30-day extension to respond to Wisconsin Medicaid’s request for additional information. If the provider returns a correctly completed packet within the 30 days, the effective date is the date Wisconsin Medicaid received the original, incomplete packet. If Wisconsin Medicaid does not receive a correctly completed packet within the 30 days, the effective date will be the date Wisconsin Medicaid receives all the complete and correct certification packet materials.

Returning a complete packet *does not* guarantee the earliest possible effective date described above. Receiving a certification effective date is contingent upon meeting all applicable licensure, certification, authorization, and other credential requirements for Medicaid certification. A provider should not delay submitting a Wisconsin Medicaid certification packet because of pending licensure, Medicare certification, or other certification requirements. Wisconsin Medicaid keeps the original certification packet on file so that a provider may send proof of meeting these criteria as soon as it is available. Once this information is received, Wisconsin Medicaid will continue processing the certification packet.

To request a certification packet not found on the Medicaid Web site, contact Wisconsin Medicaid Provider Services at (800) 947-9627 or (608) 221-9883. Providers may also call Provider Services to have a certification packet mailed to them. A similar set of criteria for determining certification effective dates apply when Wisconsin Medicaid mails certification packets to providers.

Receiving a certification effective date is contingent upon meeting all applicable licensure, certification, authorization, and other credential requirements for Medicaid certification.

Clarification of provider certification effective dates

(This section clarifies information published in the July 2001 *Update*.) Provider certification packets are mailed to providers who request them from Wisconsin Medicaid either by letter or telephone call to Provider Services. Providers have 30 days from the date Wisconsin Medicaid mails a certification packet to complete it and return it for processing. If Wisconsin Medicaid receives the provider's correctly completed packet within the 30-day deadline, the provider's certification effective date is the date the provider first requested the packet from Wisconsin Medicaid. If Wisconsin Medicaid receives the provider's correctly completed packet after the 30-day deadline has passed, the provider's certification effective date is the date Wisconsin Medicaid receives the packet.

If Wisconsin Medicaid receives a certification application within the original 30-day deadline, but the application is incomplete or incorrect, the provider is given a 30-day extension in which to resubmit a correctly completed packet. If the provider is successful in resubmitting the certification packet during the 30-day extension period, the provider's certification effective date is the date on which the provider originally notified Wisconsin Medicaid of the intent to provide services. However, if Wisconsin Medicaid receives the packets beyond the 30-day extension, the provider's certification effective date is the date on which Wisconsin Medicaid receives the correctly completed packet.

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Accessing Wisconsin Medicaid eligibility information

Wisconsin Medicaid providers have a variety of methods available to access Medicaid eligibility and other information.

Overview of the Eligibility Verification System

Wisconsin Medicaid's Eligibility Verification System (EVS) offers providers several ways to access one or more of the following: eligibility, checkwrite, claim status, prior authorization status, and other information. These methods include accessing the EVS via:

- Automated Voice Response (AVR) system.
- Commercial eligibility vendors:
 - ✓ Magnetic stripe card reader.
 - ✓ Personal computer software.
 - ✓ Internet access.
- Provider Services.
- Direct Information Access Line with Updates for Providers (Dial-Up).

To view detailed information on each eligibility verification method and a quick reference guide for using AVR, refer to the Provider Resources section of the All-Provider Handbook.

Attachment 1 of this *Wisconsin Medicaid and BadgerCare Update* is an AVR quick-entry guide for checking eligibility. Attachment 2 is a current list of commercial eligibility vendors and contact information; this information may also be found on the Wisconsin Medicaid Web site at www.dhfs.state.wi.us/medicaid/. Once at the site, select the "Medicaid Contacts" link, then select the link for "Commercial Eligibility Verification Vendors."

Contact Provider Services as an alternative to the Automated Voice Response system

If a provider receives the message "System Unavailable" when he or she attempts to access the AVR system, he or she may contact Provider Services at one of the telephone numbers listed below. Provider Services may be able to access the information for the provider, or they may request that he or she call back at a later time if they are also unable to access the information.

The hours for Provider Services are the following:

- 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays.

Provider Services is not available on weekends or holidays.

This *Update* article contains Medicaid fee-for-service policy and applies to providers of services to recipients on fee-for-service Medicaid only. For Medicaid HMO or managed care policy, contact the appropriate managed care organization. Wisconsin Medicaid HMOs are required to provide at least the same benefits as those provided under fee-for-service arrangements. ✦

ATTACHMENT 1

Quick-entry guide for the Automated Voice Response system

The following entry strings can be used to check eligibility on the Automated Voice Response system quickly. Information on the chart that is shown between brackets ([]) is entry information specific to the provider, recipient, or date(s). The abbreviations DOB and SSN refer to date of birth and social security number, respectively. Numerical values and the pound sign (#) indicate direct telephone keypad entries. Information may be entered prior to voice prompts, as long as it is entered in the appropriate sequence. At any point during the voice prompts, providers may skip to the next segment of information by pressing “1.”

Generally, providers cannot request eligibility information for future dates. However, if the provider verifies eligibility for the current date and this date is after the 20th of the month, eligibility for the following month and the current month may be provided.
