Free HIPAA-compliant claims submission software is available

The Division of Health Care Financing reminds providers that free Provider Electronic Solutions (PES) software is available for submitting federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA)-compliant claims to Wisconsin Medicaid. This software replaces the current free software supported by Proservices.

Free HIPAA-compliant software available

The free Provider Electronic Solutions (PES) software will replace the current free software supported by Proservices (known as EZ-LINK, Pace, and dental software) after the implementation of the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). The Division of Health Care Financing Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) Department will support PES software.

Providers will not automatically receive **Provider Electronic Solutions software**

Providers and billing services who currently use the software supported by Proservices will not automatically receive free PES software. Update 2003-75 incorrectly stated that providers and billing services would automatically receive free PES software if they had submitted electronic claims to Wisconsin Medicaid within the previous 12 months.

Obtaining Provider Electronic Solutions software

Providers who want to use the PES software must request it through one of the methods described below. Providers are encouraged to submit requests immediately for the PES software on CD-ROM.

Providers and billing services may request PES software from the Medicaid Web site by following these instructions:

- 1. Go to www.dhfs.state.wi.us/medicaid/.
- 2. Choose "HIPAA" from the options listed in the Wisconsin Medicaid main menu.
- 3. Select "Provider Electronic Solutions (PES) Information" from the sidebar menu.

Revision to system requirements

There has been one revision to the minimum system requirements since they were published in *Update* 2003-75. The Microsoft Windows ME operating system has been added to the minimum requirements. This revision has been included in the following chart.

Although the *Update* refers to Medicaid recipients, all information applies to BadgerCare recipients also.
