To: Prenatal Care Coordination Providers — City of Racine Only

Change to Provider Requirement for Child Care Coordination Services in the City of Racine

Effective January 1, 2012, prenatal care coordination providers are no longer required to establish a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the city of Racine in order to provide child care coordination (CCC) services to residents within the city of Racine. Additional criteria to qualify to provide CCC services remain the same.

Child Care Coordination Services in the City of Racine

Medicaid-certified prenatal care coordination (PNCC) providers within the city of Racine have the option of providing child care coordination (CCC) services in partnership with a program to reduce fetal and infant mortality and morbidity (per s. 253.16, Wis. Stats.).

Effective January 1, 2012, PNCC providers are no longer required to establish a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the city of Racine in order to provide CCC services within the city of Racine.

To qualify to provide CCC services within the city of Racine, a provider is required to continue to meet the following criteria:

 Be a Medicaid-certified PNCC provider within the city of Racine (defined as a provider whose physical address falls within ZIP codes 53401 to 53408). Establish an MOU with state-contracted HMOs
providing services within the city of Racine. At a
minimum, the MOU must identify a contact person at
both the HMO and PNCC provider's office and
address communication and coordination, including
frequency of contacts and referrals between programs.
